about the festival

May Sunday has been celebrated in Killeagh since the 1830s, when the local landlord invited villagers onto his estate for music and dancing to show off new bridges and improvements to the land.

It aligns with Bealtaine, the Celtic festival marking the start of summer. The festival continued on in the estate, which is now the community owned Glenbower Wood, until the 1920s, when it moved into the village centre.

After a 20-year lapse, Greywood Arts revived the festival in 2018.



about the festival

The festival has grown and transformed from its origins amongst the trees, bringing artists and community together to generate a festival that celebrates the abundant creativity, history and the ecology of Killeagh village.

For 2024, the festival delved into our present locality – planting seeds literally and figuratively: nascent projects flourishing, growing the strength of our community, germinating ideas and sparking conversations as we look back in time in order to move forward with wisdom and care.

We asked what it means to live in this place with a community owned woodland at its heart, renewing our relationships to nature, and to each other.





20th CENTURY KILLEAGH

community archive project

An exciting visual journey capturing the essence of Killeagh through personal photo archives and memories in the community, by multidisciplinary artist Basil Al-Rawi. His practice is concerned with the landscapes of memory, identity, politics, and mediated reality.

Basil worked with the community to collect cherished photos of Killeagh's iconic landmarks, people and everyday moments, gathering stories and recollections behind the images, through film and audio recordings.

SEED PAVILION PROJECT



about the project

Artists Phillip Ryan & Martin McGloin from Nocht Studio brought together a cross-section of the community, along with experts in ecology, to co-design a pop-up pavilion to mark the entrance to the wood during the 2024 May Sunday Festival.

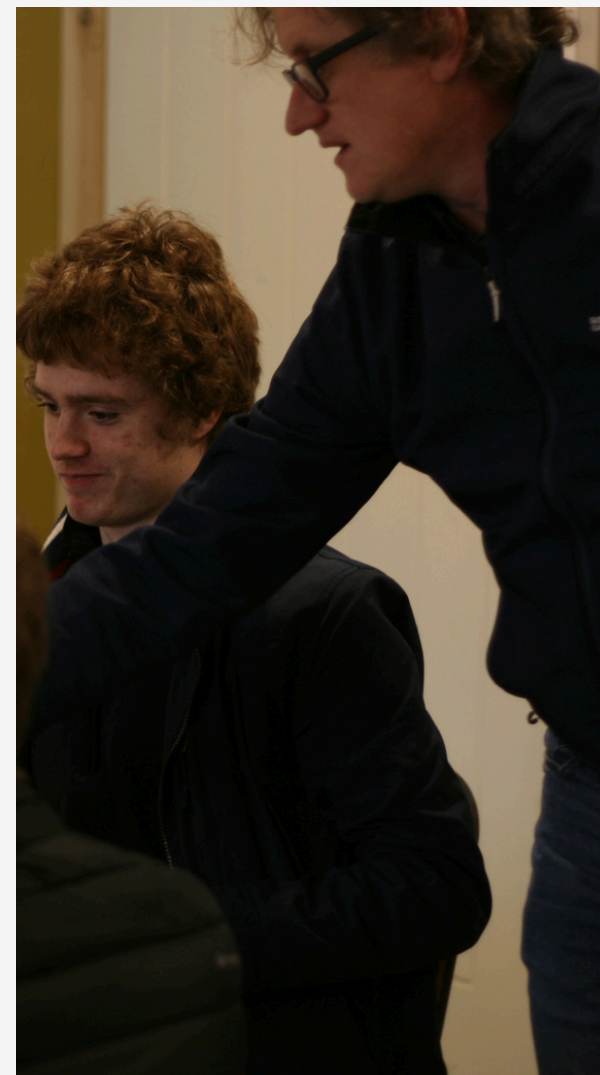
This project was supported by the Art's Council's Festival Investment Scheme.



The project focused on nature-first design methods and architectural perspectives to empower participants to shape the creation of a pavilion that held space for music, performances, talks and workshops during the May Sunday festival. The process has begun to create new collective and contemporary traditions for the village, and a lasting legacy beyond the festival. Participants represented a wide cross section of our community: Active retired, National and Secondary school students, COPE Clients and local artists and interested community members.

Nocht Studio was founded in 2018 by Martin McGloin and Philip Ryan, who both graduated from the Dublin School of Architecture in 2013. Nocht Studio's existing and ongoing body of work predominantly explores the concept of self and other, through perceived human experience in the physical and digital world.

The project engaged with a broad range of ecology and architectural experts, to support the community groups in investigating their pavilion design.



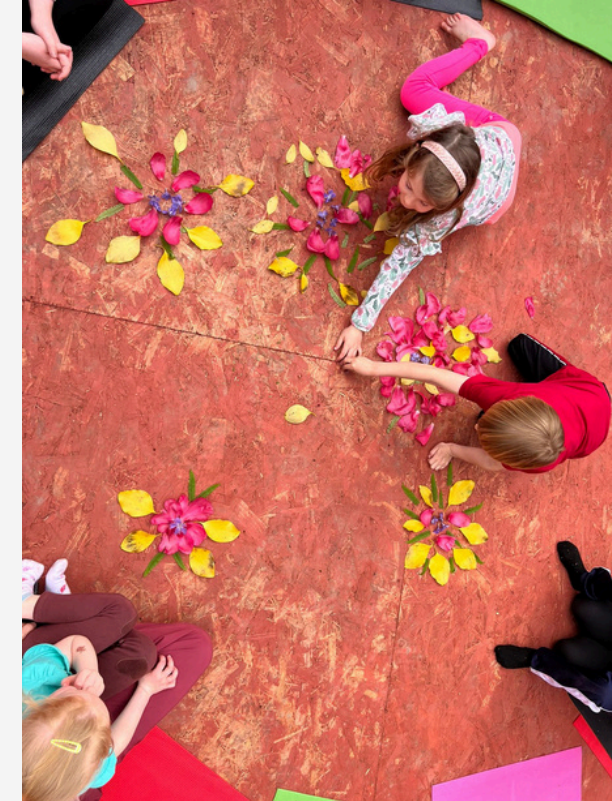

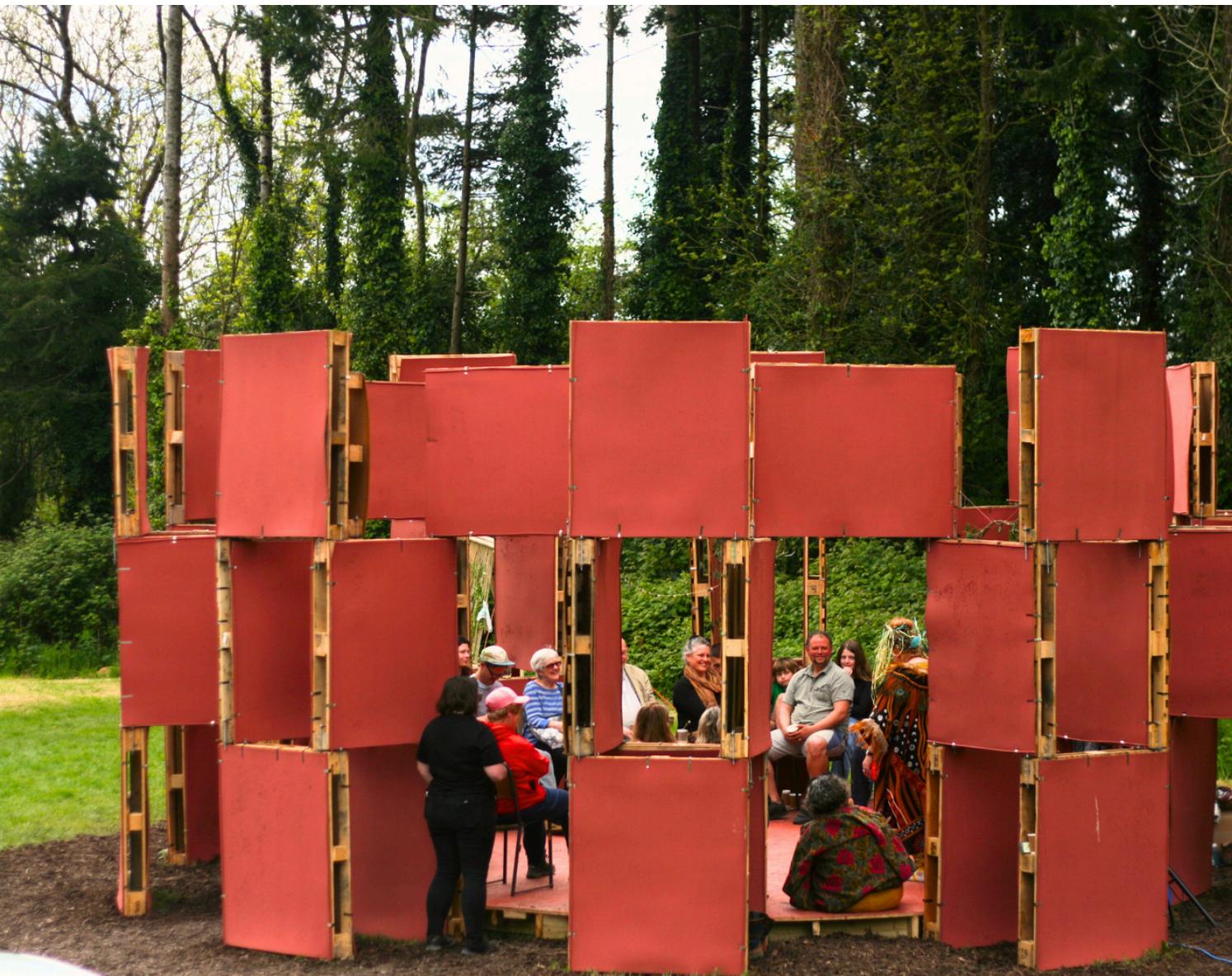

OF THE FOREST FLOOR

**art installation in glenbower wood
& at Greywood Arts**

Conceived during a residency at Greywood Arts, 'Of The Forest Floor' draws inspiration from daily walks through Glenbower Wood by the artist, Annie Tull. The aim was to craft a textile evoking the forest's essence, blending techniques like embroidery, felting, painting, and botanical printing. This multilayered creation aims to capture a dreamlike journey through wood-land memories, akin to exploring a riverbed's hidden depths.

The project began with gathering flora from Glenbower Wood, imprinting their shapes onto fabric. Layers of felted wool, embroidery, and handmade elements were added to create texture and depth. Foraged forest elements like moss and twigs were then stitched onto the fabric.

Recently returned from display in NYC for exhibition in Glenbower, the work merges seamlessly with its natural surroundings.

Annie invited viewers to engage with its organic beauty post installation, by encouraging them to pin their Glenbower Wood experiences directly to the fabric.





SEEDLINGS

growing art for growing minds

A mixed media workshop for 6–12 year olds with artist Jaki Coffey, “Seedlings” offered four creative stations, growing art for growing minds. With a focus on germinating ideas, Jaki’s approach introduced new concepts and skills to the children and watched them grow.

WELCOME

The first Sunday in May has heralded the transition to summer in Killeagh village for nearly 200 years, since the local landlord opened his estate to the villagers for music and dancing. The Celtic festival of Bealtaine goes back much further, and signifies the return of the light. Fire often played a part in celebrations, symbolically cleansing potentially destructive influences, and proclaiming a new beginning. It marked the time for livestock to be driven out to the summer pastures and rituals were performed to protect the cattle, crops and people, and to encourage growth. In recent memory, May Sunday was the day you changed into your new summer clothes.

The festival has grown and transformed from its origins amongst the trees, spilling out into village in the 1920s, evolving with each community group that has organised it. Greywood Arts has been its steward since 2018, bringing artists and community together to generate a festival that celebrates the abundant creativity, history and the ecology of Killeagh village.

This year's festival delves into our present locality - planting seeds literally and figuratively: nascent projects flourishing, growing the strength of our community, germinating ideas and sparking conversations as we look back in time in order to move forward with wisdom and care.

We are asking what it means to live in this place with a community owned woodland at its heart, renewing our relationships to nature, and to each other.

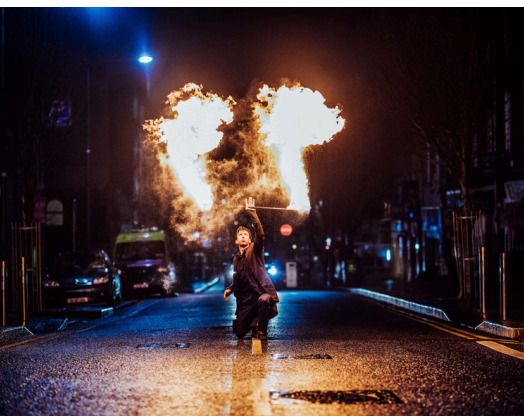

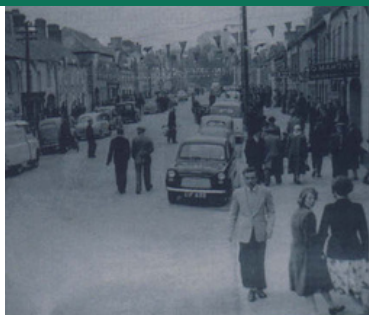

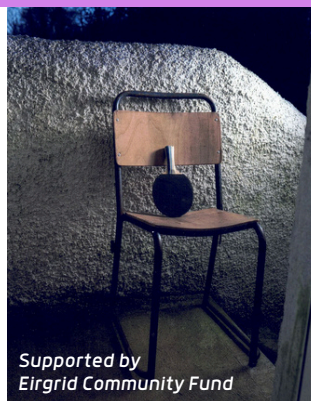

The Process:

Workshop 1: What is our vision for Glenbower? Eco-experts from the Gaelic Woodland Project, Hometree Charity and Colm O'Driscoll, head gardener of Lismore Castle Gardens, visited the groups to talk about invasive species, seed saving and biodiversity. A tree nursery was established at Greywood Arts for Glenbower Wood - and it includes a Brian Boru Oak seedling!

Workshop 2: We visually communicated our visions of the woodland with cardboard & experimented with designs by building 1:16 scale models of the pavilion.

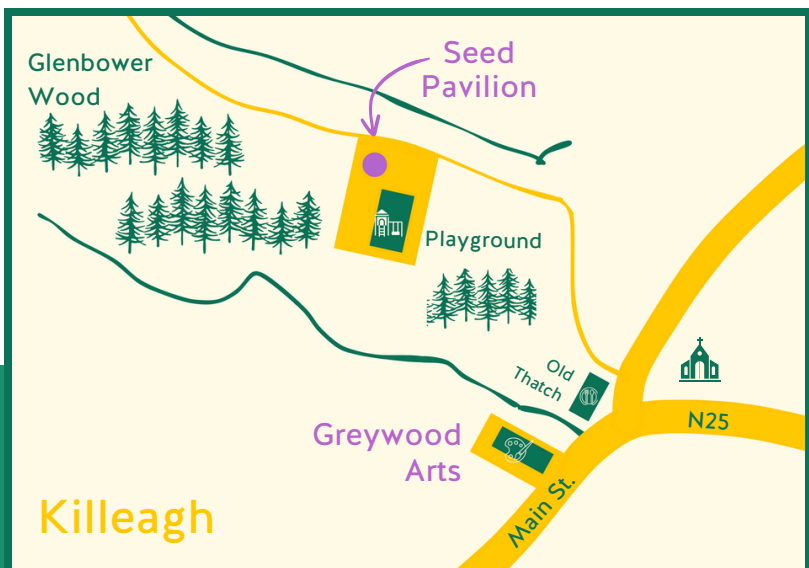
